Kate Dodd – *Bay Ridge Tree Collection*

A collaboration with Bay Ridge residents, the local library and participating artists The Bay Ridge Tree Collection had a number of components:

- The sculptural element: a site-specific installation in the lobby of the Bay Ridge Public Library that consisted of two <u>"trees"</u> covered with text that unfurls from the trunks to branches that extend onto the windows.
- The second element was a collection of miniature individual <u>"books"</u>, that represented the tree species in Bay Ridge (199 species!). The books were displayed on the "tree", stairwell railings and window mullions.
- The third element was a treatment of the existing <u>light fixtures</u> in the main reading room that consisted of lines of poetry by participating artists E.J. McAdams and Jimbo Blachly.
- 4) The fourth element was a collaboration with different community groups. These groups were asked to make a book for a favorite tree that was included in the final installation. Kate collaborated with a local environmental group, the local high school students, the library teen group and library community and a local senior group, and other community members.

Sergey Jiviten – Furrow

A collaboration with Bay Ridge Residents and the Narrows Botanical Garden

Furrow for Bay Ridge was a workshop that asked people to bring a seed to the event along with the story of their connection to the seed. Sergey etched images onto the seeds based on his conversations with each person and created a personal symbolic portrait. Sergey's performance gave each participant a voice and helped Sergey make a connection with his collaborators. The event took place at the Narrows Botanical Garden.











Aaron Asis – Alpine Under the Marque

Art in unexpected places: A collaboration with the local movie theater

Aaron worked with the owners and workers of the Alpine movie theater in Bay Ridge to help share art experiences with the community and theater goers. Meant to inspire new ideas and appreciation for the theater, Aaron installed a mural of the theater taken from an archival photo of the marque from the 1940's under the current marque. Aaron's work focuses on sharing the visible and invisible details of spaces and stories to demonstrate the power of art in helping to improve our relationship with our cities and with each other.









E.J McAdams and Jimbo Blachly – *PLAIN/AIR/ECOLOGIES/COLLECTIVE/LINK/BAG*

A collaboration with community members and Tea Arts and Culture

A silent walk and collective poetry exercise to appreciate the natural urban environment. Members of the public joined together with E.J. and Jimbo for a silent walk through Owl's Head Park that was interrupted at chosen spots for each person to write their own line of poetry. All the lines were collected in a bag and randomly put together for the final collaborative poem that was recited at the tea ceremony in the Narrow's Botanical Garden. The tea ceremony was hosted by BAC grantee Tea, Arts and Culture and music was performed by The Sound, The Sound.









Chris Costan – Interventions

A public work and collaboration with the Bay Ridge 5th Avenue merchants

Chris Costan created a series of paintings and collages that dealt with environmental issues specific to the plant and animal life of Bay Ridge and the surrounding areas. A series of high quality prints were made and distributed to store owners to display in their storefronts. Chris and Stand4 Director, Jeannine Bardo took the time to introduce the project and get to know the merchants. The merchants were very receptive and we gave the businesses shout outs on our social media pages.









Artist Talks

A series of artist talks were given through out the exhibition and included conversations with artists, Rita LeDuc, Aaron Asis, Peter Edlund, Christopher Lin, Nany Nowacek, and Chris Costan. These took place inside and outside the gallery space.
